



## One of Tohoku's largest spa resorts and a beautiful natural setting awaits you

Fukushima Racecourse is about 10 kilometers from Iizaka Spa, one of the largest hot spring resorts in the Tohoku region. Amongst others, it holds exchange race in Baden Baden Racecourse in Germany, also famous as a racecourse near a hot spring resort. The turf course is of compact design with a total length of 1,600 meters, but the thrills of racing are provided by a spiral curve between the 3rd and 4th corners, where the outcome of a race is often decided.

This allows horses to corner without losing speed.

Your enjoyment of the races will surely be enhanced by the delicious flavors of locally brewed beer, Kitakata ramen noodles and other local specialties on sale inside the course.



### Finishing posts

The beautiful natural setting of Fukushima Racecourse, surrounded by green. The finishing posts are topped by "Miharu-goma" model wooden horses, a specialty local product of Fukushima.



### Spectator seating

This, one of the largest stands in Tohoku, is a comfortable space with a wall to wall glass viewing area and full air-conditioning. All floors from the 2nd floor up offer a view over the Parade Ring, allowing spectators to enjoy the races even in wet weather.

### Hot Springs

Fukushima is famous for its many hot spring resorts. They include Iizaka, noted as one of the three best spa resorts in Northern Japan, as well as Tsuchiyu and Takayu deep in the Azuma mountains. Near them there are many sightseeing spots and natural scenery, with opportunities for the whole family to enjoy nature walks.

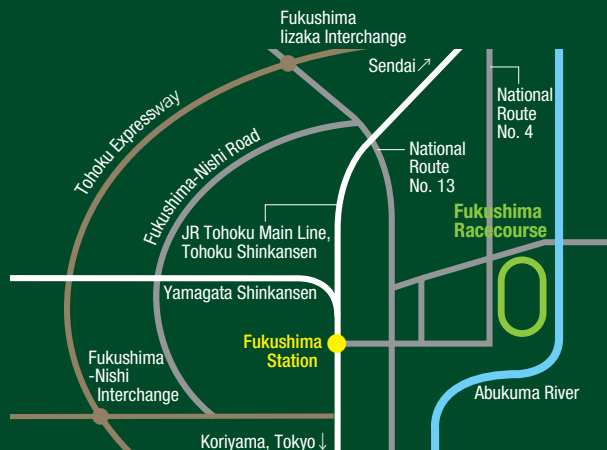

(Gates open) 09:00 (subject to change depending on congestion levels, etc.)



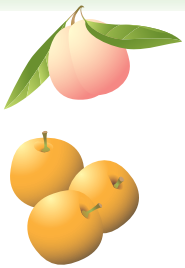

An open indoor space where popular "ekiben food fairs" and other events are held.

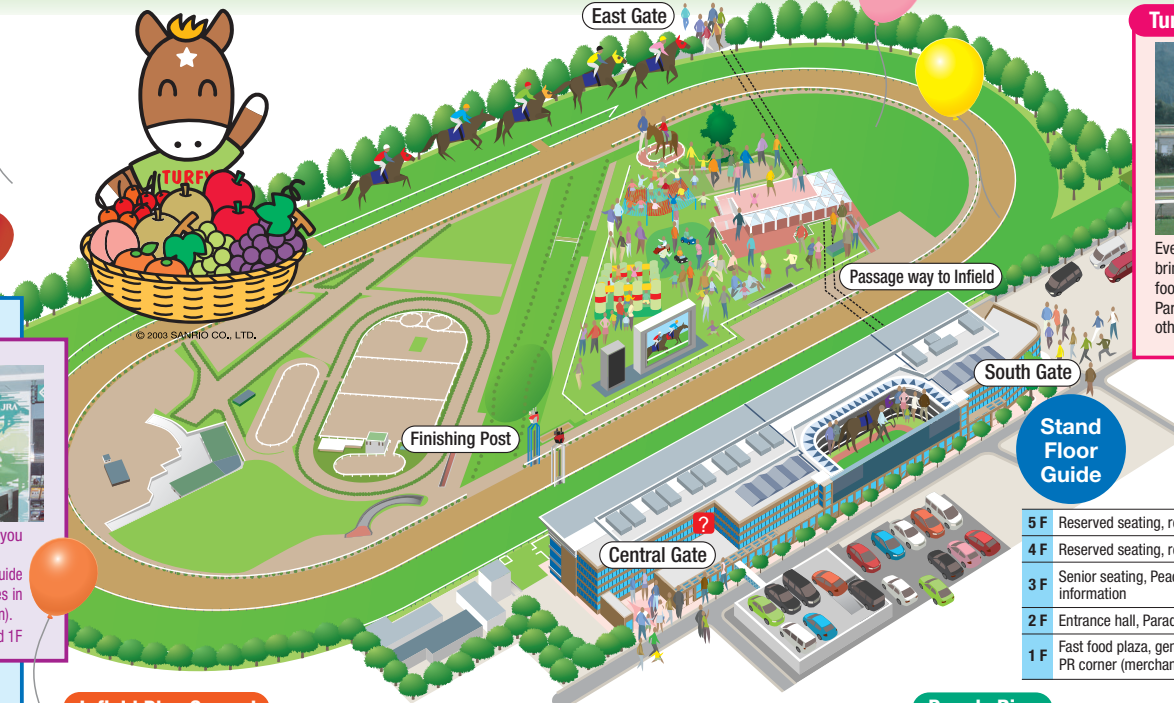


## Smoking room

- 2 F Entrance hall, Parade Ring, shops, information
- 1 F Fast food plaza, general information, children's corner, Apple Square, PR corner (merchandise shops)
